










Adult membership has risen steadily since 2016, after decreasing from 2014 to 2015.

47% increase in adult female matching membership since 2016.





Role of Sport Development

Sport development director responsibilities:

- Identify and implement development opportunities to grow the sport of ultimate within the province in accordance with Ultimate NL's strategic plan
- Oversee the clinics program for adults and youth across the province
- Provide opportunities to train new coaches in the Competition Introduction and Community Initiation streams and oversee certification, development and maintenance of coaching program
- Work with competitive players and teams to ensure resources are available for their success

National Results MUTT (Memorial Ultimate Touring Team)

- Attended Mixed Atlantic University Championships for the first time
- Highest ever finish at CUUC, finishing 5th overall in Division II





PE In-service for Teachers

- NCCP Community Initiation Coaching Course held for 10 physical education teachers from schools around the metro and avalon regions.
- Hoping to offer coaching courses for physical educators across the province.
- Goal is to increase the level of understanding of teachers, so they can pass onto students as a part of the physical education curriculum, and start schools teams.





ISOTG Day - December 7, 2019

- Spoke to youth about spirit and played spirit games at Mount Pearl Senior High Invitational Tournament
- MZU board members spoke during spirit circles at each game to talk about what spirit is and why it's important, and encouraged teams to think about their spirit as well as their opponents



Masters Skill Development Series



- 59 participants
- Ages range from 35 65 years old (average 51)
- 54 % female matching, 46 % male matching
- 45 participants (76 %) self-rated their skill level as brand new or beginner
- High level of positive feedback during/after sessions



Youth Ultimate

Role of Schools Director:

Schools director responsibilities:

- Maintain an open line of communication with coaches and teachers across the province.
- Organize tournaments and ultimate opportunities for school groups, including the Ultimate NL Senior High, Junior High, and Elementary tournaments.
- Facilitate the Discs for Schools program.
- Work with schools, athletic directors, and SSNL to achieve varsity sport status and expand ultimate across the province.

Discs for Schools

- This past fall Ultimate NL launched the Discs for Schools program thanks to our sponsor VSC.
- To date we have provided 22 schools across the province with discs to start or assist their ultimate programs - in the St. John's, Avalon, Avalon West, Central, Central East, Western, Northern Peninsula and Southern Labrador regions.



St. John's SSNL Varsity Regional

- Waterford Valley hosted on February 21st and 22nd.
- 8 teams participated, including Gonzaga, Holy Spirit, MPSH, St. Bon's, Waterford Valley and 3 teams from Holy Heart.
- Winner: St. Bonaventure's College
- Most Spirited: Holy Heart C
- MSP: Carly Clifford (MPSH), MVP: Kyle Hedderson (St. Bon's)



Cancelled Tournaments

- Due to the COVID-19 global pandemic, all of our provincial youth tournaments (high school, junior high, and elementary) for the year were cancelled.
- Before the in-person school year ended in March, SSNL regional tournaments had been in the works in the Avalon, Avalon West, Northern Peninsula (date was set for May 9), Central East, and Western regions.

Foundation Sport - Outdoor Ultimate!

- For the 2020-2021 school year, outdoor ultimate frisbee will be played for the first time!
- In conjunction with SSNL, tech standards were written by Nick House and Hilary Walsh.
- The first school regional will be held on November 1st at King George V - hosted by St. Bon's.

Role of Youth Competition and Development Director:

- Direct the Storm Provincial Team program:
 - Coaching selection
 - Travel and training logistics
 - Communications to athletes, parents, and tournament organizers
 - Waivers, contracts, and registration for the PSO and NSO events
- Oversee Development Camp and Summer Leagues.
- Community outreach
 - Communicate developmental league offerings
 - Inform athletes of adult club teams and leagues for when they graduate

2020 Youth Fall Leagues

- Elementary, Junior High, and High School Leagues.
- Development of beginner and intermediate skill level players.
- Started with fundamentals and transitioned into scrimmaging.
- 8 week league from Oct 6 Nov 24.
 - 11 Elementary athletes
 - 34 Junior High athletes
 - 37 High School athletes

2020 Youth Competition Developmental Camp

- High performance training for provincial team eligible athletes.
- Volunteers from the competitive ultimate community ran weekly sessions with input and direction from the Storm Coaches.
- 48 registrants (27 male, 21 female), ages 13-18.
- Up from 32 (17 male, 15 female) registrants in 2019.

2020 Storm Tryouts


- Objective: build a competitive junior open team and develop a growing junior women's program.

2020 Storm Tryout Participants

- 80 junior athletes tried out:
 - 36 Open
 - 44 Women
- Most athletes in storm history.
- We are growing along with a high retention rate.
- Every 2020 athlete who filled out feedback has indicated they plan to try out in 2021.

2020 Storm Tryouts Results

- Open Team
 - Selected 21 athlete roster with 3 alternates.
 - o Focused on a competitive roster.
- Women Team
 - Selected 33 athlete training pool.
 - Intended to take 28 athlete roster to CUC from 33 while still allowing all to practice.
 - Focused on growing and developing the junior female competitive ultimate community.

2020 Storm Season

- After March shutdown, Storm was able to implement a practice focused season in early July.
- Lots of Positives!!
 - One of the first junior provincial teams to return to the field (provincially and nationally).
 - Coaching staff was very adaptive to the regulations and provided creative practices while maintaining safety.
 - Crossover scrimmages between Storm team and various adult teams (Storm Alumni, MUN, Club Teams).



Role of the Community Outreach Director

- Manage existing team of Ultimate NL volunteers at events
- Recruit and assign new volunteers to their area of interest
- Maintain an up-to-date volunteer database
- Work with volunteers looking to participate in specific projects
- Maintain records of volunteer hours
- Facilitate annual Ultimate NL Awards & Volunteer Appreciation Ceremony

Game Facilitator Program Launch

Ultimate Canada is pleased to announce the launch of its new Game Facilitator program.

What is the Game Facilitator program?

The program came about due to a need for nationally supported, trained, and certified observer equivalents in Québec High School Ultimate. After consultation with Ultimate Canada and Ultimate Ouébec, it was determined that the role that was needed did not meet the traditional role of an observer within Ultimate Canada. Consultations with leagues and provinces from across the country showed that there was national interest in developing the new role.


The Game Facilitator role is a hybrid role that is somewhere between the Instructional Observer role of USAU and the Game Advisor role of WFDF. It is seen as a stepping-stone for rules knowledge development and is an entry-level position with online training. The main role of the Game Facilitator is to ensure the game runs smoothly and the rules are respected especially at the lower levels (High School and under). The powers of the Game Facilitator are limited, but they actively participate in the promotion of Spirit of the Game.

Game Facilitators can be seen as game managers who are at the field to help resolve conflicts, support the development of rules knowledge, and to report back to their organization. Whether during league play, or other events, game facilitators can add legitimacy to events similar to officials, referees, or time keepers of other sports.

The role is not meant to take any responsibility away from the players to learn the game and its rules. Rather, it's seen as a way to get more youth involved, and hopefully, lead to more observers.




