Membership:

- 998 members in 2021-22; 20.9% increase
- Adult (18+) female-matching membership has increased by 16%
- Adult membership increased by 9.3% (highest numbers ever)
- 2nd consecutive year of growth as we continue to emerge from a challenging pandemic period
- We are hopeful membership will return to pre-pandemic totals by next fiscal year

Procedures:

- COVID was still a significant challenge for most of the year
- Special Measures Order first lifted in March 2022 (mask mandate, NLVaxPass)

- Certain facilities still incorporated COVID-specific regulations (e.g. the Techniplex in St. John's)
- All COVID-19 regulations suspended → return to 'normal' game play

Diversity & Inclusion:

- Our summer students, Ava Whitten & Ryan Pickard, completed 3 clinics with the Association for New Canadians in July & August 2022
 - 85 unique participants for the clinic series
- Ultimate NL had a delegation in the St. John's Pride Parade in September 2022
 - First time the Parade has taken place since 2019

Sport Development & Competition:

- International Spirit of the Game Day: December 4, 2021
 - We ran a contest and received 11 nominations for players that best represented SOTG.
 - Megan Dunnan was the winner and she received a Ultimate NL hoodie as a prize.
- Women's Skills Development Series:
 - 8 week program that ran from March to May, 2022
 - Tempest Ultimate players and Storm Ultimate coaches facilitated the session
 - This program was partially funded by the Wellness Coalition of Avalon East
- Masters Skills Series:
 - 6 weeks of skill development programming that ran from September to October, 2022
 - Community volunteers led the sessions
- Free Skill Development Clinics
 - We offered 4 free clinics this year, 2 in December, 2 in May
 - Focused on throwing, vertical/ horizontal offensive strategies, and breaking a zone
- Summer Outreach Clinic Series
 - Our two summer students completed 35 clinics, reaching a total of 1,053 participants
- Competitive Results:
 - Tempest Ultimate: 5th place at No Borders in Ottawa
 - Regiment Ultimate: attended No Borders; finished 10th overall in the Open Division at CUCs

Youth Ultimate:

- Discs for Schools Program:
 - To date we have provided 41 schools with discs to start or assist their ultimate programs
- Outdoor Ultimate Foundation Sport:
 - The first outdoor ultimate School Sport NL regional took place in October 2021 in the metro region.
 - 10 teams participated; winner: Holy Spirit 2
 - The next outdoor ultimate regional is set to take place October 29th, 2022 (this weekend!)
- Senior High Provincial Tournaments:
 - May 7-8, 2022 at the Techniplex in St. John's
 - 10 teams participated; winner: Holy Heart 2; most spirited: WVH/ Gonzaga
- Junior High Provincial Tournaments:
 - 9 teams participated; winner: Frank Roberts; most spirited: Villanova
- Elementary Provincial Tournaments:
 - In the past we have had elementary divisions with our provincial tournaments, however, we really saw an impact on our ability to host this tournament through the COVID-19 regulations (e.g. no spectators meant parents were not able to watch/ chaperone their children).
 - We were unable to go ahead with this tournament this year but we are hopeful we will have this tournament again in 2023.
- Youth Coach Training Program:
 - A new program designed for young athletes (age 15-14) interested in developing coaching skills
 - First session took place last weekend, October 22, 2022
 - Participants in the program will be paired with schools looking to start or invigorate their school ultimate programming
- 2021-22 Youth Programming:
 - We have moved to a model where we ask parents to 'pay what they can' as a way to ensure that ultimate is accessible to anyone who wants to participate.
